Registration Information And How To Apply

The registration fee for the four-day Learning Academy is \$1,750. Admission Requirements

IASA Aspiring Superintendent Academy admission requirements are set forth as follows:

- Applicant must be able to attend the entire week. All meetings will be held at the IASA headquarters.
- 2. Applicant must provide a letter from the District Superintendent indicating support for and understanding of the commitment involved.
- 3. Applicant must provide a personal narrative indicating
 - 1) the reason you are making application to the IASA Aspiring Superintendent Academy,
 - 2) what you hope to gain from the program, and
 - 3) what you can contribute to the other cohort members.
- 4. Applicant understands the commitment to the time schedule away from the current School District to effectively participate in this program.
- 5. Applicant agrees to cooperate and fully participate.
