



Illinois School Referenda Election Results - April 4, 2023

Results of the April 4, 2023, referenda related to public school districts in Illinois reveal that x of the x questions, or x%, were successful and x of the x questions, or x%, were defeated. The results of the tax referenda, based on unofficial tallies gathered by an IASA email survey and internet research, are reported in two sections: successful and unsuccessful. The school districts are listed by IASA Region and then by county within the Region; the county is determined by the location of the district's administrative office.
