Mentoring Program

IASA employs a group of highly qualified, retired superintendents who serve as Field Services Directors and are mentors to first, second and third-year superintendents. IASA is divided into 21 regions and each new superintendent is paired with a Field Services Director from the same area. You can call or email your Field Services Director with any questions that arise. They are available 24/7 to assist you!

In addition, the Field Services Directors may organize in person or Zoom weekly, bi-weekly or monthly meetings to provide timely information to mentees. The meetings are also the perfect networking opportunity for you to collaborate with peers. If there are topics that you feel your region would benefit from discussing, always let your FSD know and he or she will organize an opportunity to connect.



Professional Development Opportunities

Workshops:



Budgeting Basics

Offered in July, this workshop walks participants through the budget process from development of the tentative budget through adoption of the final budget.



Preparing and Filing the Tax Levy Certificate

Offered in October, this workshop helps administrators better understand how to file the tax levy certificate.



Bonds 101

Offered in the fall, this workshop for early-career superintendents provides information on various short-term and long-term finance bonding options available to school districts.



Spring Budget Amendment

Offered in the spring, this workshop provides information to administrators and bookkeepers on the required steps and timelines to complete the budget amendment process.



Finding Your Way Around IWAS

Offered in early summer, this workshop helps new administrators navigate the ISBE Web Application Security (IWAS).



PERA, Evaluations and SB 7/RIF: Putting it All Together

Offered in January, this workshop is intended to help administrators with evaluation, retention and dismissal of your staff.




Evaluator Academies

Offered throughout the year, IASA hosts Evaluator Retraining Academies, Principal Evaluator Initial Training Academies and Teacher Evaluation Initial Training Academies.

Board-Superintendent Relationships

This new IASA academy, taught by former superintendents, is intended to help early-career superintendents improve relationships and communications with members of their school board. Coming Soon!



Health Life Safety Compliance

Offered in the fall and spring, this academy provides administrators an in-depth look at, and discovery into, topics related to Health Life Safety and Compliance.



Collective Bargaining

Offered in the winter, this academy provides an in-depth overview of the concepts included in the Interest-Based Bargaining method that can be used as problem-solving techniques as well.



Safety Site Assessment

This new academy focuses on how districts can take an annual standards-based approach to assessing the security of school buildings, grounds and policies by teaching the Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) framework.

IASA Aspiring Superintendent Academy




Bill Tracker/Analysis Tools


Superintendent Job Transition Document




Publications and IASA Podcast


stories about innovative programs throughout the state and issues important to public education.


Illinois Energy Consortium Powered by Future Green

WCSIT and ISDA help school districts provide affordable workers' compensation coverage and combat the high cost of traditional property/casualty insurance. To date, WCSIT, has awarded over \$21 million in payments back to members and paid approximately \$200 million in claims. ISDA provides property/casualty insurance coverage to over 130 school districts across Illinois.
